Dundurn National Historical Site (Dundurn)

Campers will explore the more than 40 rooms on three floors and gain perspective on the life of the MacNab family and their servants working below stairs. Campers will also explore the rich history of the property including the War of 1812. Burlington Heights, where Dundurn now stands, was the location of a large British Military post in 1812.

Hamilton Museum of Steam & Technology National Historic Site (Steam)

Campers will witness the social and mechanical life of Canada's early industrial revolution. Housed in a 150-year-old Waterworks, this National Historic Site preserves two 70-ton steam powered water pumping engines, perhaps the oldest surviving Canadian-built engines. The historic Hamilton Waterworks is a Civil and Power Engineering Landmark.

African Lion Safari® (ALS)

A Wildlife Park dedicated to the conservation of declining wildlife species. It is home to over 1,000 exotic birds and animals that roam freely throughout seven distinct drive-through Game Reserves. Campers will take a ride on the tram through the park, watch birds in action, spend time getting to know the elephants and more! Spray area will be used based on availability and weather.

Wild Water Works (WWW)

A waterpark operating on conservation lands in Hamilton. Campers will rotate in groups to the parks attractions, including the wave pool, water slides, Eazy River, and Squirt Works (younger campers only). Note that park policy will require all campers 10 and under to wear a life jacket in the wave pool and Eazy River and meet minimum height requirements for use of water slides. Campers in lifejackets will remain in the shallow end of the wave pool with their group. Campers 11 and older will be required to stay with a buddy while utilizing the wave pool.
